2. The vice-president requested that she be allowed to dispose of the many vases collected over the years for various table decorations. Suggestion was made to take the vases to Goodwill and Eleanor Hoomes offered to do so.

3. The Spring District meeting date of March 13, 2004, was announced. The CCWC will be the host club. S & R Catering will be contacted about the arrangements.
