Program—The Department of Public Affairs was in charge of the program for October. Diane Sharp, Chair, introduced Kent Brown, Carrollton architect, who spoke on "Rehabilitation of the Carrollton Depot".

Old Business—

• Update on Salad Luncheon—

- Martha Thurman thanked everyone for helping make this year's luncheon very successful. Food that was left over was carried to the Emergency Shelter and to the New Hope Boys' Home.
- O Nancy Tunnell reported that the silent auction raised over \$2000 for CCWC; the cookbook and bake sale raised over \$600 for Ferst; and over \$600 was made for the Home Life Department from the sale of lighted cubes, pumpkins, and fall arrangements. Several items left over from the auction are up for sale, as well as several lighted cubes, fall arrangements, and cookbooks.
- o Janet Kiczek, Treasurer, reported that members' tickets and other tickets sold raised \$2700.

 - o The club trip to Tallulah Falls was quite informative and enjoyable.

- O CCWC will exceed \$50,000 in coupons this year for military families overseas. Club participation has been excellent. However, Laura has tried a number of times to contact the base to which these mailings have gone and has received no response. If there are no objections from members, this project will be dropped for 2008 and the club will proceed to work on the care package project for soldiers in the Middle East.
- **Treasurer**—Janet Kiczek reminded members that the final payment of dues is due in October.
