Noted that Treasurer, Callie Mohn was over-run last meeting, by a large number of guests and non-eating members. The Carrollton Parenting Program is in constant need of many things, in addition to all things for baby care. We have their "Wish List."

1st Vice President Martha Ann Saunders-Noted progress in obtaining liability insurance for the club. Any funds from the Foundation donated to the club will be covered. In effect, we do the ground work.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Tallulah Falls – Joan Borders : President of Tallulah Falls School, **Dr. Kent Anglin** was a big success at the March general meeting. We are planning a fall trip to the school.

Community Improvement Projects – Karen Hartley – BTIO dolls are about to be “adopted” at Oak Mountain Academy for 2 weeks. They will then be “expected” back at Central Middle School. The Decorating Den has offered window treatments for the new Women's Emergency Shelter condos. BTIO brochures are currently being printed. Funds for BTIO and the new president's CIP (when selected) will probably be separated. The Carrollton Chamber of Commerce is coordinating civic clubs and organizations. Junes luncheon is projected for Pilgrim's Restaurant in Tallapoosa.

Legislative – Martha Ann Saunders: SB 141 Passed, allowed for provisional voting and new voting machines. The Safe place for newborns bill passed, but the ethics bill is hung up in committee. McCain-Feingold passed, but has been challenged; **One to watch- HB 587** Proposed by Senate Rules Chmn David Scott, would allow off-road vehicle to use roads without permits or modifications, at sppeds under 45 miles per hour. This would include dirt bikes, ATVs, 4 wheelers, etc.
