Public Affairs has mailed several care packages to soldiers in the Middle East and is now collecting stuffed animals, school supplies, toothbrushes, and other small items for soldiers to give to the Iraqi children. The children's gifts were requested by a Bremen soldier who is stationed in Iraq.

Toiletries worth \$50 were delivered to the Emergency Shelter on August 3. 1,820 coupons worth \$1,881.90 were mailed to COMFLEACT in July for overseas military families.

CIC: The Community Action Team for Ferst Foundation in Carroll County continues to

work on fundraising, registration, and publicity.

The team has raised over \$36,000 toward this year's goal. Registrant numbers have increased from 149 in July to 668 in August, and 912 books will be mailed in September.
