Challenge Grant

The Carroll County Ferst Foundation for Childhood Literacy is the CCWC's current Community Improvement Contest (CIC) Project. All our members are involved in this effort and the community has responded enthusiastically. As the project nears the end of a year of hard work and fundraising, an anonymous donor has come forward with an exciting challenge grant. This donor has pledged \$25,000 as a matching gift to the Community Action Team's raising of \$25,000 by February 15, 2006. The challenge means that all dollars raised by the team will be matched by equal dollars from the donor. The team will be actively working to raise this money as soon as possible.

The Ferst Foundation for Childhood Literacy is working to get books into the homes of young children on a monthly basis in an effort to increase learning readiness. All donations stay in Carroll County and are used solely for books for the children of Carroll County. Currently over 1,200 children in our county are receiving monthly books from the foundation.
